My Dear Parish Family,

A celebration is an honoring, especially by solemn ceremonies or by refraining from ordinary business, marked by festivities or other deviation from routine

A feast is an elaborate and unusually abundant meal often accompanied by a ceremony or entertainment something that gives unusual or abundant enjoyment

A festival is an event celebrated by a community and centering on some characteristic aspect of that community

I am very excited to share that our St. Mark Parish Family will have a 3-day long festival this year on the weekend of Corpus Christi, titled EUCHARISTIA. It will be a celebration of the gift the Lord gives to us in His Body, and the gift we are to one another in our Parish Family.

Friday, June 17 will be a prayer festival of healing; we'll gather together in praise and worship before our Eucharistic Lord, in the church, around His table. It will be a celebration of His mercy, where we will feast on His mercy through anointing, offered to all...His mercy extended for our bodies and souls.

Saturday, June 18 will be a meal festival - a family picnic, family feast; a celebration of the gift we have in one another in our families, parish and community. We will feast on food, fellowship and fun, all for our body and soul. This will be the family reunion so many in our parish have been longing for.

Sunday June 19 will be a Eucharistic festival, a celebration of Our Lord's love for us and His presence among us as we worship at 11AM Mass, feasting on His Body as food for our body and soul then we'll join in a Eucharist procession professing to our community our love of Jesus and our desire for all to know Him.

For me, this will also be a celebration of my 1st year as pastor here with you. It will be a time of thanksgiving for me, a thanksgiving I will offer the Lord for gifting me with your presence in my life, and it will be a thanksgiving I will offer to you for all the support, love and care you've extended to me and my brother Trinitarians. The Lord has so richly blessed us all and it is my joy to live life with all of you here at St. Mark.

I want to see all of you for as much of this time as you can come, to celebrate this beautiful time together. Since I came here last July, we've not had a chance to really come together as a parish family because of COVID. There are so many wonderful things happening here - you've been doing so much good. I am so proud of you all and I'm very much looking forward to celebrating EUCHARISTIA with each one of you.
