A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear St. Mark Parish Family,

In the Gospel, Jesus tells his followers, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

A problem arises because the English language uses the one word, love, to describe a wide variety of experiences. This little four-letter word can have several different definitions depending on the context within which we use it.

Although Jesus did not speak English, he may have known several languages: Hebrew, the official language of the Jewish people; Aramaic, the everyday language of the people in Palestine; and Greek, the language of the Roman empire. Of these three languages, Greek will be the most helpful in determining the type of love Jesus has in mind for his followers.

There are several different Greek words for our one word, "love." Philia is a love that describes the relationship between two friends. Eros is sexual love.

Agape is self-giving love. Of these three different words for love, agape is the one we most frequently find on the lips of Jesus. Agape is a love that focuses on the needs of the other person. It is freely given without counting the cost and without thinking of getting anything in return. Agape looks beyond physical beauty, color of skin, political beliefs, and status. It means reaching out to all people even if they are repulsive or if society considers them worthless. It is the love that should be the hallmark of every Christian. "See how they love each other!" was the way non-Christians described the early followers of Jesus.

After God, you, yourself, are the greatest gift in your life.

Your faith is also a gift. So share them both! When you give the gift of yourself to others you imitate your Maker! God is not stingy! As His followers, neither must we be! When you live your life in the selfless, generous and joyful manner that God intended for you to live, your life instantly becomes a gift for others. Share the treasure of your life today!


ST. MARK COMMUNITY OUTREACH MINISTRY


