A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear St. Mark Parish Family,

Pope Francis spoke about the role of the family as the first educational school, and he stressed the need to respect the family as the first institution of education. It is important as a Catholic community to look upon this as an opportunity with hope for new ways to bring our school and parish communities together. There are some great opportunities to bring people to celebrations, and to pray together that allows for more parents to join in and participate in the celebrations.

"Catholic Schools are places where children and young people encounter Jesus, and where they are encouraged to enter more deeply into a personal relationship with Him. They are privileged places, together with the family and the parish community, where our faith is handed on, and this can only succeed with the cooperation of all concerned." (<u>Renewing the Promise</u>, p. 25)

Parents...your parish community and your Catholic school are there to support you in caring for and nurturing your children. Work with the school community to help your child realize the gifts they have been given by our Creator God. The cooperation that exists between the home, school and parish is an integral part of Catholic education. The school can play a significant role in facilitating a meaningful relationship between the parish and home.

Catholic schools promote a strong link between the home, school, and the parish. These three partners are connected through their love and support of the child. They serve as three pillars for the mission of the Church and embody our responsibility to future generations. No one of these partners alone is the Church, but each one in their faithfully distinct way lives the mission of the Church.

This partnership strengthens Catholic Education and needs to be nurtured and cultivated. Parishes and the schools have a wonderful opportunity to work collaboratively to celebrate the faith with our students and their families. For this collaborative effort to be successful, it is important to build a relationship based on trust, mutual respect and shared responsibility. Our parish provides opportunities for children to grow in their faith life in both a sacramental way and a spiritual way. The parish builds upon and extends the work of both home and school in the development of faith. Catholic schools are places where the 'New Evangelization' can take root by inviting students and their families into a deeper relationship with Christ. The experience of community within the school can gently fan the embers until they burst into a flame of faith.

God has given us a great gift which we can put into practice. As parents it is the authority to bless our children daily and often. What is a Parental Blessing?

A Parental Blessing is the ability to call down God's blessings upon your children. As parents we have a special responsibility and duty to entrust our children to God and our prayers have a double effect upon them. God has given them to us and it is our duty to give them back to God.

How do I give a Parental Blessing?

Making the sign of the Cross on the child's forehead or heart impart a blessing and say one of the following or allow the Holy Spirit to give you the words to say:

May God bless you; May God keep you safe; God be with you; God be in your heart; May God bless and protect you.

You can bless your children at any time. Some suggestions: when going to school; going out to play; and going to bed each night.

Blessing our children each day brings God into the mind, heart, and conversation of our child's being and in a tangible way teaches our children to turn to God often.

What Greater Gift Can You Give?

When someone passes away, extend them a Plenary indulgence. It is so easy. If you received Communion daily, went to Confession monthly, and fulfilled the conditions state below, you could release a soul to heaven every day of your life. There is an army of souls in purgatory ready to help you. If you help them, they are especially anxious to help you. They cannot help themselves. Those who are released by your prayers and sacrifices are indebted to you and full of gratitude. They will be your prayer partners forever.

Conditions for a Plenary Indulgence:

Be in the state of grace. Receive Communion each time a plenary indulgence is sought. Go to Confession within 20 days before or after doing the prescribed work. Have a disposition of Catholicism detachment of sin, even venial sin. Pray for the intentions of the Pope, preferably one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary". Have at least a general intention to gain a plenary indulgence. Fulfill one of the following:

- At least a 1/2 hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- Or family or group Rosary or private Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament
- Or at least a 1/2 hour of pious reading of Sacred Scripture
- Or walking the Stations of the Cross in a church or with properly erected display of the Stations
